- Pursuant to the OUA Memo 00-0521-0171 entitled BACK TO SCHOOL: LET A MILLION FLOWERS BLOOM PROJECT and in connection to the Revitalization and Strengthening of Youth for Environment in Schools Organization (Yes-O) Program under DepEd Order No. 52 s. 2011 and DepEd Memorandum No. 187, s. 2018 Implementation of DepEd School Inside a Garden (SIGA) Program, the SDO Nueva Ecija will participate in this project for the School Year 2021-2022.
- 2. In connection with this, **all Elementary and Secondary Schools** are enjoined to participate to this project to help uplift the spirit of learners, parents, and teachers, as well as to show gratitude and appreciation to teachers for all the hard work they showed amidst the COVID-19 pandemic in continuation of the delivery of quality education to learners.
- 3. With today's high-tech and fast-paced lifestyle taking its daily toll on everyone's lives, this project aims to relieve stress as nature provides us simple way to improve emotional health, especially flowers. The presence of flowers triggers happy emotions, heightens feelings of life satisfaction, and affects social behavior in positive manner far beyond what is normally believed.
- 4. Through this project, the Youth Formation Unit in SGOD encourages all the schools, including those schools that are located along highways to plant flowering plants and let them bloom in time for the opening of classes for SY 2021-2022. Each school through the leadership of the Youth for Environment in Schools-Organization (YES-O) Teachers-Advisers and in support of the School Inside a Garden (SIGA) coordinators shall conduct the following activities:
 - a) Designate a minimum of 10 square meters land area in front and/or by the side of the school and must be visible to the public. If the school has no available land area, the school **can use alternative recycled materials** like plastic bottles and sacks for planting the flowers.
 - b) Plant sunflowers or any flowering plants available within the area of the school. Philippine native plants are recommended, such as kamuning, katmon, gumamela, etc.
 - c) The school shall plant the saplings 1-2 months or earlier in time for the flowers to bloom on the opening of classes.
 - d) The school may seek partnership from their respective Local Government Units (LGUs), private sector, and even the parents/guardians of their learners for the said activity.

e) The expenses to be incurred shall be charged against the local funds/school MOOE in accordance with existing accounting and auditing rules and regulations.

f) The activity shall be performed in accordance with the local health protocols set in place in relation to the COVID -19 pandemic.

- g) The YES-O coordinators are requested to document the whole duration of the project and post these on their OFFICIAL SCHOOL FACEBOOK PAGE OR GROUP using the hashtags #DepEdProjectMillionFlowers and #depedkabataan2021. Photos consisting of before, during and after of planting flowers should also be posted on the "BLSS-YFD- School in a Garden" Channel of the "OUA School Photos" Microsoft Team.
